NISD's Ron Myers, Ph.D. Named Principal of Byron Nelson High School

At the May 12 school board meeting, Superintendent Karen G. Rue, Ed.D. recommended Ron Myers, Ph.D. as the principal of Byron Nelson High School

"It is my pleasure to recommend Dr. Myers as the principal of Byron Nelson High School," said Superintendent of Schools Karen G. Rue, Ed.D. "Dr. Myers brings 26 years of educational experience with a broad understanding of instruction that meets students' needs at the secondary level. I am confident in his abilities to help our students reach personal, social and academic success."

Myers is no stranger to the Bobcat community. Currently, he is serving as Byron Nelson High School's associate principal. Prior to, he was principal of NISD's O.A. Peterson Elementary School.

"I'm looking forward to continuing to serve the Bobcat community at Byron Nelson High School," said Ron Myers, Ph.D. "I am anxious to build upon the traditions that have already been established and continue to grow a school that is focused around culture, community, student success and learning."

Before joining the Northwest ISD family, Dr. Myers was the Director of Intervention Support in Keller ISD. He has served students and families as a principal in Keller ISD and schools in Oklahoma. He earned his Ph.D. in educational administration curriculum and supervision from the University of Oklahoma. Myers has a master's in education from Baylor University and earned his bachelor's in education from East Central University. He has been an adjunct teacher at Texas Woman's University and Dallas Baptist University since 2005. Dr. Myers has presented at conferences across the state including the Texas Association of School Boards and has facilitated and led several planning and curriculum based committees.

Dr. Myers replaces Linda Parker, Ed.D. who was named NISD's Executive Director of Secondary Education at the April 28 school board meeting. Dr. Myers will begin to transition into his role as principal this spring.
