NISD's Jennifer Alexander, Ed.D. Named Executive Director of Student Services

At the April 14 school board meeting, the NISD Board of Trustees unanimously approved Northwest ISD's Jennifer Alexander, Ed.D. as the executive director of student services.

Alexander has served as the district's assistant director of special education since 2010. For the past 14 years, she has worked in Northwest ISD as a special education supervisor, educational diagnostician and a special education support teacher. Prior to joining Northwest ISD, she was a special education teacher and a speech therapy assistant in Eagle Mountain-Saginaw ISD.

"I am thrilled to begin this new chapter in my career at Northwest ISD," said Jennifer Alexander, Ed.D. "I have a passion for public education, parent and community relationships, curriculum development, and successful student outcomes. This position allows me to focus on my love of student learning."

Alexander earned her doctorate at Nova Southeastern University in May 2014. She holds a master's degree in curriculum and instruction and a bachelor's degree in communication disorders from the University of North Texas. She has served as an instructor for crisis prevention (CPI) and a Texas Behavior Support Intervention (TBSI) trainer. Alexander has been selected for numerous leadership roles in Northwest ISD such as campus leadership teams and the National Institute of School Leadership.

"Dr. Alexander is uniquely qualified for this position," said Superintendent of Schools Karen G. Rue, Ed.D. "I am confident in her abilities, and I look forward to seeing her excel in this leadership position. She has been instrumental in coordinating services for students through K-12 and has built strong relationships with campus leaders and parents."
