NISD Announces Sarah Stewart as Executive Director of Construction

Stewart has a bachelor of arts degree in interdisciplinary studies from the University of Texas in Arlington and will graduate with a master's of business administration from Western Governors University next year. She is also a 2001 graduate of Northwest High School.

As a resident of Fort Worth, Sarah is active in the Northwest ISD community. Her husband is a football and track coach and teaches government at Northwest High School.
